Program Schedule

ELCI is a part-time, hybrid program, the core of which will be delivered through six modules. Each module will take a multi-faceted approach that integrates multiple learning techniques such as formal instruction, class discussions, expert panels and speakers, and group work.

Supply Chain Dependencies	An in-depth look at an organization's third-party ecosystem. Capstone Project

A cumulative capstone project will provide you with the opportunity to apply and consolidate your learnings. The project will be worked on in groups, to be assigned during the first module. These project groups will bring together learners with varied backgrounds and skill sets in order to maximize peer-to-peer learning.

Via an in-depth written report, along with a presentation to an executive panel of industry experts, capstone projects will entail a demonstration of your newly developed understanding of digital risk management considerations and strategies, multi-disciplinary perspectives, executive communication, collaboration and leadership skills.

Some time to meet with your assigned groups and work on the project will be provided during in-person modules. However, learners should expect to commit some time outside of scheduled course time to focus on their projects.

Mentorship Program

Career mentorship is a key component of ELCI. Based on your responses to the Mentorship Program Questionnaire, you will be matched with a senior leader who will be invested in your career growth.

Your mentor has committed to providing a minimum of 15 hours of one-on-one support during the course of the program. As a mentee it is your responsibility to engage with your mentor and drive the relationship – your mentor will provide you with personalized career advice, insights and support in line with your professional goals.

Mentorship programming will be provided to help support you as you start this new relationship. Please reach out to the Catalyst team if you ever require assistance in engaging with your mentor.

Email

Formal ELCI-related communication will be sent to the email address provided in your application. Please inform us if there are any changes to this address.

Slack

ELCI uses Slack to facilitate discussion and collaboration between learners, faculty and staff. All learners will receive an invitation to join the ELCI Slack Community prior to the start of the program, using the email address on file.

Class 365

ELCI uses the Classe365 learning management system to store program resources. All learners will receive an invitation to make an account and join the platform prior to the start of the program. Classe365 will be organized by module and act as a central repository of program resources such as reading and assignment materials.

Zoom

ELCI's virtual sessions will take place on Zoom. If requested in advance, and depending on the presenter, topic and nature of the session, learners may be able to receive access to a recording of the virtual event.

Zoom has the following accessibility features that can be used during live sessions:

- Accessibility settings: Adjust the font size of chat and closed captioning
- Screen reader support: The latest screen readers can be used on Zoom
- Third-party captioning: Integrates seamlessly with third-party closed captioning providers through [Closed Captioning REST API](#)
- Rearrange videos: Customize your gallery view by clicking and dragging videos to a different position
- Multi-pinning: Pin multiple videos for your own custom view

Learners are expected to attend all four in-person residencies in full. In addition, learners are expected to attend virtual sessions, and actively participate in group work and mentoring sessions.

While not required, it is encouraged that all learners stay at the recommended hotel during in-person modules. This will provide opportunities to network and get to know one another outside of the formal program, a key objective of the in-person learning components.
